This camp will provide an opportunity for high school students (9-12 grade) to learn about the intersection of traditional cultural philosophies and the environmental science that provide a foundation to care for the land and water that is such an integral part of Wabanaki heritage.

Students will spend a week immersed in culture-based learning and environmental science experiences, and will have the opportunity to learn about:

- Traditional land skills
- Wabanaki philosophies of caring for the environment
- Stream and fish ecology
- Tree and plant ID
- Forest ecology for the area
- Medicinal and edible plants
- Geology, Archeology and Petroglyphs of the area
- Wetland ecology
- Work with Wabanaki Dept. of Natural Resource professionals, elders, and other natural resource professionals
- Develop a possible career interest in the environmental field.

Recreational activities will include canoing, hiking, swimming and lots of fishing!
